

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

History & Excellence

Lahore College for Women University, with a full time enrolment of about 19,000 students and a teaching faculty of more than 600 members, is one of the most prestigious institutions of Pakistan. It admits students at the Intermediate, Undergraduate and Postgraduate level.

At the time of autonomy, in 1990, there were Masters classes in only six areas, but now with the University status, LCWU is offering degrees at undergraduate, post-graduate and doctoral level. BS 4-year degree program is being offered in 46 disciplines in which 5 years Phram-D, DPT, and Architecture degree is being offered. University is offering MS/MPhil. in 33 subjects. The University is also offering Ph.D. programs in 24 disciplines i.e. Bio-Technology, Botany, Chemistry, Zoology, Computer Science, Mathematics, Environmental Science, Physics, Political Science, Management Sciences, Pharmacology, Education, Applied Psychology, Islamic Studies, Urdu, Punjabi, Fine Arts, Mass Communication, City & Regional Planning, Persian, Geography, International Relations, History and Economics.

Lahore College for Women University, established in May 1922 as an intermediate residential college, was originally housed in a building on Hall Road, Lahore, with strength of 60 students (25 boarders) and 13 staff members. By 1950, the college strength increased to 600 students and was shifted to the present building on Jail Road.

LCWU by 1922 was affiliated with the University of the Punjab for undergraduate program in 18 subjects. Within the next two years the institution had graduate programs in 14 subjects. Post graduate classes in English were initiated in 1940 and Honours classes in five subjects were introduced in 1949. B.Sc. classes started in 1955 while Post-graduate classes in the subjects of Economics and Physics started in 1966. By 1979 Islamic Studies, Political Science and Psychology were also added to the ever increasing list of programs.

The year 1990, when Administrative and Financial Autonomy was given to the institution, proved to be the turning point in the history of LCWU. On 13th August 1999, it was declared a Degree-Awarding institution. The institution was elevated to the status of a Women University on 10th September 2002.

The 21st century has brought a drastic revolution in science, which has completely transformed the world. Today sciences are exploring areas that defy imagination. Keeping in line with the importance of the sciences in today's world, LCWU has been fulfilling the demand of the female students in the area, as this was the only institution offering science subjects at undergraduate level. This is evident from the fact that majority of the female doctors, serving and retired, have at some stage (F.Sc. or B.Sc.) studied at Lahore College for Women. Since 1922 the college has proved its worth as the highest seat of learning for science subjects. At the moment Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, Bio-Technology, Mathematics, Economics, Statistics, Electronics, Environmental Science, Computer Science and Pharmacy are taught at Graduate, Postgraduate and Doctoral levels.

LCWU is cognizant of the significance of social sciences and liberal arts since they contribute to the aesthetic sense of human beings and are essential for the society. The Department of English, being more than 70 years old, is the oldest post-graduate department of the University. Founded by Prof Mrs. U.K. Siraj-ud-Din, it still is rooted in the traditions of scholarship and academic excellence. Besides English, Urdu, Punjabi, Islamic Studies, International Relations, Political Science, Fine Arts, Pakistan Studies, Mass Communication and Gender and Development Studies are being offered at graduate and postgraduate level. The graduates of LCWU take their place in moral, intellectual and professional leadership in all walks of national life. Among its alumni are an extra ordinary number of teachers, physicians and professionals in all fields of life.

At F.A./F.Sc. level the intermediate college of LCWU is affiliated with the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Lahore for the purpose of examinations. This Intermediate college has proved to be a very fruitful nursery in providing women force for professional education in the province.

Since the establishment of LCWU as a university, the institution has striven for improvement in Higher Education. MoU with various national industries and linkages with foreign universities have been established in the field of Pharmacy, Electronics, Environmental Science, Fine Arts, Economics, Mass Communication and Gender & Development Studies.

Diploma in Bioinformatics

A 1-year diploma program consisting of 2 semesters for studying the combination of biology and computer science managed by the acquisition, analysis, storage and dissemination of biological data. Large commercial enterprises like pharmaceutical companies employ bioinformaticians to perform and maintain the large scale and complicated bioinformatic needs of their industries. With an ever-increasing need for constant input from bioinformatic experts, most biomedical laboratories may soon have their own in-house bioinformatician. The individual researcher, beyond a basic acquisition and analysis of simple data, would certainly need external bioinformatic advice for any complex analysis.

Bio-informatics is used in biomedicine dealing with the analysis, storage, manipulation and interpretation of macromolecules such as DNA, RNA and proteins. Conversely, wet lab analysis of computationally predicted functionally relevant motifs/segments of macromolecules further enhances our understanding of complex mechanisms occurring in cells. It will also provide an opportunity for learning modern techniques and help students to exploit new ways for solving complex biological problems. It will also train human resources particularly women in this advanced and challenging field, and develop skills which are definitely job oriented.

The aim of this program is to achieve excellence through development of produtive skills for Biotechnology and Bioinformatic professionals/researchers/research scholars to handle multifarious challenging needs.

Botany as part of Biology is being taught to intermediate classes since 1922 at LCWU. B.Sc Degree Program (2 years) was started in 1956. Postgraduate degree was launched in 1994 by the endless efforts of then, Head of the Department Prof. Mrs. Khatoon Zahoor. A four year BS degree program was initiated in 2005, whereas MS, MS leading to Ph.D and Ph.D programs were started in 2009.

Mrs. Dilara Muqueet, Ms. Prem Madan, Prof. Khatoon Zahoor, Mrs. Shamim Sattar, Prof. Rashida Zafar, Prof. Zafar Hussain and Prof. Dr. Farah Khan served as HODs from 1956 to 2022. Ms. Prem Madan would always be remembered as a legendary teacher and HOD. Prof. Dr. Zubaida Yousaf is working as the Chairperson since January 2022.

Since 2002, 7000 BS, 500 MS and 36 PhD have passed out from the department. Our alumni are leading and serving in different private and Government offices; Schools, Colleges, Universities and Research institutes both at national and international level. Our esteemed faculty members have completed 11 research projects funded by various sources. Department of Botany has organized three different patents and 500 publications are also on the credit of our department. Three conferences, four seminars/webinars and ten trainings/workshops. Two faculty members have participated in five different international conferences as participants, poster and oral presenters viz., Canada, UK, UAE and Turkey. Department has recently constituted first Industrial Advisory Board of the university. Our departmental research journal was started in 2019 which is HEC recognized Y-category also (included in HJRS). We have also a registered scientific society named "Botanical Society for University Women". Our one faculty members have completed Postdoc from national institutes and six faculty

members from international institutes. One fellow is currently in USA for Postdoc and another one will be joining University of Tokyo Japan this year. Our two PhD Scholars have availed IRSIP (by HEC) and one has availed IRSIF (by PHEC).



The department of Physics was established in 1951. Mrs. Hajra Khan was the first head while Mrs. Munawar Mansoor, Miss Naeema Mohsin, Mrs. Qaisra Shiraz Khan, Prof. Mrs. Yasmeen Ali and Prof. Dr. Rehana Zia were the other former heads of Physics department. Presently Prof. Dr. Zohra Nazir Kayani is the head of Physics department. B.Sc classes were started in 1958 and later B.Sc (Hons) classes were conducted in the 1960's. M.Sc program was started in 1966. Ph.D program has been successfully launched in 2003. MS Nano Science & Nanotechnology (Regular) program was started in 2022.

Currently, the department enrolls students for 4 years BS (Physics) Regular and self-support program, 2-year MS Physics (Regular and self-support), MS (Nanoscience and Nanotechnology) regular program and Ph.D. program.

Department of Economics

Overview

The Department of Economics was established in 1922 with the commencement of Intermediate Classes. Bachelor Level Classes were initiated in 1925. In 1966, Masters Level Classes were introduced as Master of Arts (M.A.) in Economics with the strength of only six faculty members and 23 students in the first batch. Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Economics was initiated in the Department in 1999. The BS Economics (4-Year) program was offered by the Department of Economics in 2005. MS Economics (equivalent to M.Phil.) program started in 2009. Currently, Department of Economics has around 26 faculty members and more than 1500 students are getting benefit from their expertise. The basic aim of the department is to familiarize students not only with the economic aspects of the modern economy but also with the techniques that help them in empirical analysis of current economic issues and to create ability in them to make judgments regarding public policy. The graduates of the Department of Economics have joined popular careers in ranging from own businesses, banking sector, government departments & agencies, academic profession to research organizations. The Faculty of Economics is keen to follow the teaching methods that encompass both theoretical and practical aspects. Lectures, presentations, written assignments, quizzes, tests, case studies and interactive class sessions are given due importance for professional development of the students. Overview

The Department of Home Economics was established in 1975 at LCWU with Nighat Shah as the first Head of the Department. At that time, this subject was offered only at the Intermediate level. Mrs.Anjum Mirza joined LCW in 1977 as the next Head of the Department. Under her tenure, the subject was introduced at Bachelors level due to immense interest of the students. Initially the course outlined by the Punjab University was followed. After attaining charter, the course was revised and updated. In 2005, a four year degree program of BS (Hons.) in Home Economics was introduced under the directions of the Honourable Governor and HEC. The syllabus was developed in line with the recommendations of the National Committee for the revised curriculum of HEC. Mrs. Abida Talaat took charge as Head of the Department in 2008. The curriculum was updated in 2011 by Higher Education Commission and approved by Board of Studies in June, 2012. In the year 2012, Mrs. Ishrat Azhar took the charge of department. The new curriculum is currently being taught and inculcated from September 2012. Mrs. Yasmin Mudassar took charge as head of department on 4th October, 2018. After her retirement, Dr. Mehreen ljaz took charge on 6th March, 2019 as Incharge of the department.



psychological and sociological influences of dress, the physical aspects of appearance, and the influences of gender, sexuality, ethnicity, and class on the development of personal identity are explored through the study of style in traditional cultures, popular culture and everyday life. Readings, discussions and research enhance the student's skills in interpreting and articulating their understanding of art, fashion, clothing and culture. Historical Design development: apparel, furnishing, costume, textile arts and non-apparel. Cultural factors that influence designs and designers: textile production and textile art forms, textile as a medium for self-expression and communication across cultures and civilizations and as a source of inspiration for contemporary textile designers.

Outcomes

The course is designed to enable the Textile Design student to apply professional industry principles to job situations. Experience gained as a result of this familiarizes the student with career options and the necessary skills and preparation to obtain them. The four year degree program will provide students with the current portfolio requirements for the fashion and Textile industries.

The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: Learning, Teaching, Assessment, abbreviated in English as CEFR or CEF or CEFRL, is a guideline used to describe achievements of learners of foreign languages across Europe and, increasingly, in other countries.

The basic French language skills that the students will acquire through CEFR OR CEF OR CEFRL are as follows:

ORAL COMMUNICATION

Students will be able to use familiar expressions in given situations and respond.

OVERVIEW

The history of Persian Department is the history of Lahore College for Women University, Lahore. The Persian Department has a glorious past comprising of nine decades. In 1922 when Lahore College for Women was founded there were only few departments like Chemistry, English, Urdu, Philosophy, Physics, Economics, Political Science and one of these was the Persian Department. The key factor behind the establishment of the Persian department in Lahore College for Women was that the Persian language was the only official language of the sub – continent starting from Mahmud Ghaznavi's period to the Mughal Era. In addition, seventy five percent of Urdu language is derived from Persian language. A great treasure of religious books is in Persian and many other have been translated in Persian language. These books are an authority in religious teachings too. Many rare manuscripts are also available in Persian literature.

The Department of Persian is one of the oldest departments of Lahore College for Women University, Lahore. The importance of this department has justified its existence in university and contributed to its growth. The department has produced prominent scholars like Dr. AarfaSayeda, Ms. KishwerNaheed and Ms. ShabnamShakeel who have enhanced its stature and status.

Prominent faculty members like Mrs. Q.A Chishti, Syeda Ashraf Bokhari, Mrs. SaeedaChaudhry, Mrs. MehboobAbid Ali, Mrs. NafeesaAthar, Mrs. SaeedaAsif, Dr. KhalidaAftab, Dr. Zamurrad Salman and Mrs. Rafia Shah have rendered their services in this department in the past.

The Persian Department is actively arranging and participating in various co – curricular activities within university and in other educational and cultural institutions. The co – curricular activities are comprised of essay writing competitions, poetry recitations, debates, declamation contents and Olympaid on Persian Language and Literature

IRANOLOGY CENTRE

The department maintains cordial relations with the Iran Culture Centre in Lahore, the embassy of Islamic Republic of Iran, and various Iranian universities. The Centre has contributed a lot for the capacity building of the faculty and in strengthening the department.

In October 2008, an MOU was signed between the Iran Culture Center, Lahore and Lahore College for Women University, Lahore. The implementation of the above referred MOU started in November, 2008, with the construction of In-charge office of Iranology Centre. The construction work was fully funded by the Iran Culture Center which included the construction of office along with a library. The aforementioned office was inaugurated on 11th November, 2008. Furthermore, the Iran Culture also strengthened the office by providing furniture and fixture.

A delegation from Lahore College for Women University headed by the Vice Chancellor Dr. BushraMateen along with other three members including Ms. FaleehaKazmi (Incharge Department of Persian) went on a one week visit to Iran i.e. from November 12 to 19, 2008). During their stay, the members of the delegation visited Mashaad, Tehran and Qum. The main purpose of the visit was to promote educational, cultural and inter – universities relations between the two brotherly countries.

The Centre has been provided with books, computers, a lcdtv, a water dispenser, tiles (imported from Mashhad, Iran) and furniture and fixture by the Iran Government to familiarize the women graduates and faculty of Lahore College for Women University, Lahore with the culture of Iran, so that they can take due advantage of this facility available at their doorstep. This project will serve as a strong measure in strengthening the mutual ties between the two nations i.e. Iran and Pakistan.

LANGUAGE LAB

In the month of February 2012, the construction of the Iranology Centre was completed. The Centre as well as the Persian Language Laboratory and library cum seminar room are fully furnished. The primary function of the construction of the library–cum–seminar room in Utaq–e–Iran Shanasi and the Persian Language Laboratory is to provide access to young women graduates and literary scholars to Persian Language and Literature and to acquaint them with the rich culture and traditions of Iran.

In short there has been an incredible projection of Lahore College for Women University in Iran through the Iranology Centre. It has enabled an active interaction between Lahore College for Women University and Iranian universities. In a broader prospect, this Centre has cemented the brotherly and bi–lateral relations between Pakistan and Iran.

Establishment of Ferdowsi Chair at LCWU:

Abu'l-QasimFerdowsiToosi(c.940-1020) has been a very famous Persian poet and the author of Shahnameh ("The Book of Kings"). He is celebrated as the most influential figure in Persian literature and the National poet of Iran. Ferdowsi's Shahnameh is the most popular and influential national epic in Iran and other Persian-speaking nations.

Considering the importance of Ferdowsi's work, the Persian Department at Lahore College for Women University proposed establishing of Ferdowsi Chair in LCWU, to the Saadi Organization, government of Iran which was accepted very kindly. This Organization chose Prof. Dr. S. Faleeha Zahra Kazmi for the mentioned Chair because of her expertise in Persian epic literature. For this purpose, they alsoprovided funds to the Persian Department which is a very kind and exceptional gesture under this chair.

They Two young faculty members of the Department, Ms. Amber Zulfiqar and Ms. Maria Umer were invited to go to Iran to attend a fully funded teacher training course for one month through the Ferdowsi Chair.

Under the leadership of the Vice Chancellor, LCWU, prof. Dr. UzmaQuraishi, the Ferdowsi Chair has arranged the international conferences and workshops and visits of Persian students to attend the language courses and signed the MOUs

- MS students went to Iran to join a Persian Language course, financed by Saadi Organization in November 2016.
- The Department of Persian also got more than 100 rare research books under this Chair.
- · Saadi Organization Iran has also gifted a generator to the Ferdowsi Chair.
- The Ferdowsi Chair with the collaboration of Iran Cultural Centre, Lahore.
- This Chair organized a 3-Day international conference on "Shunning Sectarianism and Promoting Interfaith Harmony for Peaceful Coexistence in 2016".
- An International Conference on the theme "Commemoration of FerdowsiToosi" (13-15 March, 2017).

We can hope that after the establishment of the Ferdowsi Chair in Persian Department at Lahore College for Women University, the educational and cultural relations between Iranian and Pakistani institutes will flourish and it will also raise the research standards in Persian language and literature.

Upon the successful completion of the first and second semester course work and passing of the comprehensive examination of Ph.D the scholar will produce a research proposal which if approved by the Departmental and Advance Integrated Studies & Research Committees, will be topic of Dissertation/Thesis. Then student will prepare the dissertation/thesis under the guidance of faculty member(s) of the department.

On the satisfactory completion of the program of study (course Work and Dissertation/Thesis) the scholar shall be awarded Ph.D Degree in Persian. Persian shall be medium of instructions.



Overview Disaster Management

Disaster management is an emerging discipline and Pakistan lacks qualified Disaster managers and professionals for future needs.

Besides that, the International Conference held in Sendai, Japan has formulated a new framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFDRR) which has superseded the

Hyogo Framework for Action (HFA). The close inter-linkages between sound Disaster Risk Reduction, environmental management and climate change impacts and land use planning require a more systematic and comprehensive approach to disaster management. Considering the importance of Disaster Management for all professions (Doctors, Engineers, Planners, Military officers, Social Scientists, Logisticians, Risk Managers, Decision Makers, etc.) proper education and training is required.

There is a severe shortage of qualified and trained professionals in this field besides that gender mainstreaming also very important aspect of the discipline therefore it was highly recommended by the international community where the role of women must be of prime importance. The case of establishing BS DM Program was presented by the chairperson of CRP department in 71st meeting of the academic council held on 6th –August- 2019 vide letter Reg/LCWU/1992/Dated 23-August-2019. The program was launched from fall 2021, after required communication with Higher Education Commission vide letter no. HEC/ACAD/LCWU/BS: DM/2020 July 17, 2020.

Disaster Management is an inter-disciplinary and multi-disciplinary academic field devoted to various aspects of disaster management across societies and cultures. 

The history of the Department of Computer Science dates back to 1996 when it was started as a computer centre by the grant provided by Ministry of Social Work and Women Development. The Department started ICS classes in 1997 in addition to offering Short Courses and Diplomas. The Lab facilities were extended with the grant from Punjab Information Technology Board and started BCS classes in 1999. The Department started 4 year BSCS degree program in 2000 and expanded its facilities in 2001 with the funding provided by Higher Education Commission. MSCS degree program was introduced in 2002. The Department was shifted in its new building in 2005. The Department started PhD degree program in 2011. (Hons) in Educational Leadership and Management will be the 4-year degree programme. It is 130 credit hours programme. The program provides an opportunity for participants to develop specialized research skills as a foundation for further professional investigation in the substantive area of educational leadership. The programme offers challenging curricula, a variety of teaching-learning methodologies and a supportive academic environment to meet its objectives. This programme offers variety of courses regarding the area of leadership and management like instructional leadership, women leadership, strategic leadership, managing and leading change. This programme offers variety of subjects like curriculum development, general methods of teaching, human development and learning to polish the skills of students regarding teaching.

This approach will allow participants to understand the knowledge needs, epistemological stances, and possible biases of various actors and stakeholders in the field of education. This course will allow the participants to gain insight into how research-based knowledge is generated and used in various ways for assessment and evaluation purposes. Furthermore, development of participants' academic writing through shared writing and peer response seminars will be emphasized. The mode of teaching and learning will be in English.



Overview

The Department of Pharmacy Practice is an integral part of the Faculty of Pharmaceutical and Allied Health Sciences, LCWU. Our mission is to transform pharmacy education into more pragmatic, patient-oriented approach, which improve lives through safe and effective use of medicines.

Learning Objectives

This course focuses on the role of a pharmacist in employing pharmacotherapeutic modalities for a disease state management. Emphasis is given on the intricate integration of disease pathophysiology, clinical pharmacology and therapeutics, to devise an appropriate pharmacy care plan. These plans include rationale use of drug - entailing drug selection, dosing regimens, expected outcomes of drug therapy, key monitoring parameters, clinically important drug-drug or drug-disease interactions, counseling, and compliance issues.

This course focuses on the fundamental principles of drug absorption, distribution, metabolism and elimination by a human body. Furthermore, applications of clinical pharmacokinetics in clinical settings involving case studies of commonly dosed drugs enable pharmacists in managing complex disease pharmacotherapeutics. The course will help to expand the knowledge chest of a pharmacist in clinical pharmacokinetics.

This course is designed to get the advance knowledge of state of the art research tools employed in clinical pharmacy research to enhance student's ability to plan, execute, analyze/interpret data and write scientific reports/thesis.



The course enables students to acquire knowledge of biostatistics concepts and resources to be applied in clinical epidemiology, pharmacoeconomics, pharmacovigilance and pharmacogenetic research themes.

INTRODUCTION

The Lahore College for Women University offers hostel facilities to boarders coming from other cities and abroad excluding the local students. There are separate hostels in Lahore College for Women University, Lahore for Intermediate, Graduate, and Postgraduate students.

ALLOTMENT

- •Students are required to apply for hostel accommodation on the prescribed admission form.
- •The Chief Warden will allot hostel accommodation. Due to limited accommodation facilities, the hostel seats will be provided to the students only on merit and all other applications will be put on the waiting list.
- •The seats of quota are reserved as per Government Policy.
- •Hostel admission is offered for one academic year only, extension for another year is based upon good conduct and academic performance.
- •The hostel accommodation facility is unavailable for MS/MPhil, MA/MSc (Evening), and diploma/certificate programs.
- •Residents expelled from the hostel will not be eligible for re-admission.

HOSTEL CHARGES

- •The Hostel Supervisory Committee is authorized to give hostel fee concessions/waivers to deserving boarders.
- •The Hostel Supervisory Committee is authorized to increase /change/amend hostel charges due to cost of living/revision of pay scales or other administrative compulsions.
- •The Hostel Supervisory Committee is also authorized to waive off Hostel Charges in case of unusual circumstances for which boarders are not responsible.
- •Hostel Charges can be increased in unusual circumstances/inflation.
- •The hostel dues (Utility Bills, Janitorial Services, and Maintenance) shall be received, quarterly.
- •Mess dues and Generator Charges shall be received, monthly as prescribed cost.
- •Room cooler charges at the rate of Rs.2000/- per month will be charged in April at the beginning of the summer season, for a period of 6 months/ per month (as applicable).

- •Boarders have to pay their fee by the 15th of every month and after the due date, they will be charged a fine of Rs.50/- per day. However, the intermediate boarders are exempted from this provision.
- •If a border fails to deposit the monthly dues within the 15th of the next month, she may not be allowed to avail of the hostel facility.
- •The mess facility will be suspended due to non-payment of mess dues, with a warning issued by the Hostel Warden.
- •The student who does not deposit the fee on time will have her seat canceled and the seat will be allocated to the next student on the waiting list.
- •Membership in the hostel mess is compulsory for every resident.
- •No concession is offered to boarders in hostel dues.
- •In case of seven days of consecutive leave from the hostel, boarders can have the concession of a one-week deduction in their mess dues.
- •All dues deposited by boarders including the security shall be forfeited if she is expelled on disciplinary grounds.

IN/OUT TIMINGS

- •Boarders should strictly observe the in/out timings notified by the warden during summer and winter, i.e. 7:00 p.m. in summer (15th April 14th October) and 5:00 p.m. (15th October 14th April) in winter, anyone falling short of the discipline in this regard will be strictly checked.
- •To ensure security as well as the presence/arrival of boarders in the hostel, they are required to mark attendance while entering or leaving the hostel.
- •The Warden will monitor the attendance.
- •Attendance must be observed at the time of breakfast/lunch/dinner.

GATE PASSES

- •Gate passes are issued to all the boarders by the respective Warden/Assistant
- •Wardens, on Friday and Saturday, to go home on weekends.
- •Self-pass will be issued to the boarders by the Warden/Assistant Wardens after written permission of the parents/guardian.
- •Self-pass will be issued to:
- •The graduates and the postgraduate boarders for their Research work projects, Field Work, and Internships on the recommendation of the research supervisor and Chairperson of the Department.
- •The borders can go shopping only once a week on Saturday.
- •Self-pass is not allowed to the Intermediate boarders.

- •Senior boarders {Ph.D, MS, Pharm-D (V-Prof)} can go out without passes and will enter their name, purpose to go out, time of exit, and entry on the register at the hostel gate.
- •Curfew time for senior boarders would be till 7:00 pm for hostel boarders who go out for their research work or internship.
- •No boarder will be allowed to enter the university after 7.00 pm.
- Senior boarders {Ph.D, MS, Pharm-D (V-Prof)} will be able to enter the university up to 7:30 pm by paying a fine of Rs. 200/- every time.
- ·Hostel gates will be closed as per notified timings.
- •Failure to comply with register requirements or the curfew regulations may result in disciplinary measures.
- •If any boarder has to attend any function/party/trip of the University after the hostel closing time then she will take the written permission of the Chief Warden after verification from the concerned Chairperson of the Department.

VISITORS POLICY

- •At the time of admission to the hostel, every student's parents/ guardian must provide a list of a maximum of four visitors on the prescribed form giving details regarding name and relationship, copy of CNIC, contact number, etc. This list must be signed by the parents/ guardian.
- •Appointment of a local guardian by the parents/ guardian is appreciated who will be contacted in case of any emergency.
- •Visitors of the boarders are not allowed to visit their rooms or to stay with them.
- •The visitors/guardians are allowed to meet the boarders only during the specified timings/schedule given by the hostel administration from time to time.
- •The security guard of the hostel will ensure verification of the visitor and will properly record their particulars in the security register after receiving original ID cards from the visitors which will remain in his custody until the visitor leaves. In case of any emergency, one of the family members, mentioned in the hostel visiting list of the boarder has to come to take the boarder home.

DURATION OF BOARDERS STAY IN THE HOSTEL

- •All the students who are granted admission to the hostel, their stay in the hostel will be for the duration of their on-campus studies as mentioned in the Academic Regulations.
- •Hostel facility will be provided to the Ph.D. boarders initially for a period of 3 years which can be extended up to 5 years on the recommendations of the Departmental Doctoral Committee.
- •Every student should stay in the accommodation allotted to her by the concerned authority. She will not be allowed to change accommodation once allotted unless approved by the Chief Warden.

- •Every student should stay in the accommodation allotted to her by the concerned authority. She will not be allowed to change accommodation once allotted unless approved by the Chief Warden.
- •If there are surplus or vacant seats available, students of MS and Ph.D applying for shorter duration can be accommodated, and permission shall be granted by the Chief Warden on a case-to-case basis with charges.
- •If the outgoing classes (Intermediate Part II, BS 8th Semester, MS/M.Phil 4th
- •Semester & Ph.D.) vacate the hostel after completing their academic session and come again for practical, viva, thesis work, and convocation. They will be charged Rs. 1000/- per day (excluding mess dues), and if they stay for more than 14 days dues will be charged according to all existing dues.

PUNISHMENT

- •In case of any hostel rule violation, the hostel warden will give a written warning to the boarder, however, in case of serious violation of rules, the parents will be informed in writing.
- •Any boarder who violates the hostel rules and is found involved in any negative activity like a strike or instigating other boarders for this purpose will be liable to disciplinary punishment.
- •The case will be forwarded to the Hostel Students Affairs Committee on the recommendation of the Chief Warden for further appropriate action. The boarder may be expelled from the hostel after three warnings and will not be allowed to re-admission.
- •If a boarder extends her leave/stay at home, the parents will immediately inform the concerned hostel warden for such an extension.
- •If a boarder extends her leave/stay without informing the hostel authorities. The concerned hostel warden will inform the parents immediately, if no information/response is received from the parents or boarder the case may be referred to the Hostel Students Affair Committee and the Committee will give a decision as per the nature of the case.

INSPECTIONS

•The University or the Hostel Administration can inspect at any time. The hostel premises, boarders room, almirahs, bags, etc. without any advance notice.

HOSTEL ENVIRONMENT

- •Every boarder is expected to maintain peace, tranquility, a calm atmosphere, and discipline in the hostel and respect the rights of others.
- •Boarders are not allowed to take their breakfast, lunch, and dinner in their rooms.
- •Boarders will take care of the cleanliness of the hostel.
- •No one is allowed to misbehave with the administration and employees of the hostel in any situation. Violation may cause expulsion from the hostel.
- •Boarders must not disturb or cause inconvenience to other boarders and should ensure peace.
- •Smoking, drinking, use of liquor/drugs, and keeping weapons (licensed and unlicensed) is strictly prohibited in the hostel and entails expulsion.
- •Boarders should not keep costly items and excessive cash with them. The hostel administration will not be responsible for any loss.
- •No political and religious extremist activity or propagation is allowed in the hostel.

HOSTEL PROPERTY

- •Boarders are not allowed to damage the hostel property. Any boarder found guilty will be liable to pay the damage in addition to a fine.
- •Hostel administration can impose a penalty if she fails to keep her room clean and tidy. Moreover, if there is any complaint against a room servant, it is the responsibility of the boarder to inform the hostel administration.

HOSTEL FEE & SECURITY/REFUND

- •As per HEC-approved policy, the admission fee can be refunded within 15 days of submission. After 15 days half the fee would be refunded and no refund thereafter.
- •Hostel security must be deposited at the time of admission to the hostel.
- •If the boarder leaves the hostel during a semester, hostel dues for that semester are not refundable.
- •A boarder who is willing to leave before or after completion of their academic session can claim their hostel security within six months of leaving the hostel.
- •In case of expulsion from the hostel due to indiscipline or misconduct, security deposits will be forfeited in full.

CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE

A certificate of clearance duly signed by the boarder and their father/guardian is required to be submitted to the concerned Hostel Warden at the time of leaving the hostel

NOTE: The hostel will remain closed on Eid holidays and in case of any unusual circumstances. In addition, rules and regulations issued from time to time will also be applicable
